EDITORIAL

Amazônica is an international scientific journal, aimed to promote debate, construction of knowledge and dissemination of scientific research results related to the four fields of Anthropology - sociocultural, archaeological, biological and linguistic.

The journal has seven sections: original articles, translations, reports, current research news, theses and dissertations summaries, book reviews and photo essays. In each of them we accept original works in Portuguese, English, Spanish and French.

The periodic is semi-annual, but we can receive special editions during the year, including dossiers. All articles are peer reviewed, in the form of blind review. Any researcher interested in sharing his/her research with the academic public not only from the Amazon can submit articles. All articles must be submitted by the magazine's website, hosted in the UFPA journals portal, at http://periodicos. ufpa.br/index.php/amazonica.

The journal has 20 issues since it was released in 2009. Currently the journal is in Volume 10 Number 2 of 2018. According to the last evaluation of Capes, Amazônica is with Qualis B1. In addition to Qualis Capes, we are also actively working for the most appropriate indexing in other diverse indexes such as Scielo.

The journal has as responsible editors Diogo Menezes Costa, professor at the Federal University of Pará, and Erica Quinaglia Silva, professor at the University of Brasília.
